Opportunity For All



School Start Up


You contributed over \$14,000 this year. These funds have been distributed across 25 schools so far. This has helped disadvantaged children feel included by giving them the best opportunity to thrive – providing for uniforms, school supplies, swimming lessons and much more. School chaplains have been able to identify students in need and provide appropriate help immediately. They are extremely grateful that you have strengthened their hand, enabling them to give much needed support to students and families.

The Hope Store

The Hope Store has been operating for a number of years; connecting with local communities in Beenleigh and beyond. Each year, the volunteers who work within the Hope Store make the most of every opportunity to spend time with the clients, responding to their needs and making life changing connections. The Hope Store is a place where everyone is welcome.

Indigenous Support

You continue to support our Indigenous advocates Darryl and Edwina Lingwoodock as they bring kindness and leadership to Indigenous people. Through their connections, you bring hope to people in prisons both physically and spiritually. Your support both financially and practically, through volunteering, allows us to show kindness to Aboriginal Elders during NAIDOC week at Musgrave Park. This is the largest gathering of Indigenous people in the country!



The Hope Space

The Hope Space continues to host community projects such as registered training organisations that help school children to be ready for the work force. The Tactile Learning Centre teaches older high school students practical skills; including the cobbler trade and professional barista lessons. Students receive a certificate for completing their training which they can use to secure a job once they have finished their schooling.

It is now also used by Mimi's House (Brisbane) to help disadvantaged children feel valued and have worth, giving them the best possible chance at receiving a good education and having a full life.

Help Day & Help Crews

In 2019 you have continued to build meaningful relationships by showing the love of Jesus through practically providing for community needs. Over 300 Hope Centre people participated in Help Day 2018, delivering almost 30 projects by bringing a revolution of kindness to local communities surrounding our 4 campus locations. You have helped to change lives and to bring hope into seemingly hopeless situations; as well as partnering with local schools, governments, and community groups.

- A school in Brisbane's west now has a welcoming space for students who are struggling with life issues. It's a space where they can come to talk and grow.
- Our work in a government housing precinct has been instrumental in seeing relationship with some of the residents.

In addition to this you have spent hundreds of hours, on a week-to-week basis, practically helping individuals and families in need through Hope Centre Help Crews. This could be anything from mowing lawns to building a fence. Sometimes just the opportunity to have a conversation, with someone who is lonely, is the greatest gift.

Red Frogs

Over the past year, Empire Young Adults has continued to partner with Red Frogs to build life giving environments at "Iglu Residential College" in QUT Kelvin Grove and "Student One Residential College" in Brisbane's CBD. You have enabled the Hope Centre Red Frogs teams to create community through weekly pancake cookups, fortnightly cooking classes and monthly outings. From these communities we are growing genuine relationships that support university students during their times of need.

Night Watch Chaplaincy

Safety has a new home in Brisbane's Fortitude Valley. This new facility with visible street frontage now has incredible space to house:

- The NightSafe Rest and Recovery Space – a space equipped with 11 beds and staffed by qualified medical personnel.
- A Safe Space – for those experiencing anxiety and in need of emotional support.
- Communications Centre – taking calls for those needing assistance, as well as connecting with personnel on the ground patrolling streets in the entertainment precinct.

Our monthly support assists ChaplainWatch to provide a safe place for those in need.

Chaplaincy

You continue to actively participate with our school chaplains through financial support in over 10 schools. Our chaplains are enabled to provide much needed support to children in schools. Through your support, Hope Centre has been able to engage with both children and parents through chaplain run programs such as annual dad's camps and pancake breakfasts. You have been able to assist a family who is struggling with the cancer journey, bringing some joy to a tough situation. All schools involved with chaplaincy recognise the great contribution that Chaplains bring to their community. Through supporting school chaplaincy you continue to impact and influence both current and future generations.

Primary Schools & High Schools

In the past 12 months, there has been a growing number of Hope Centre people who have signed up to teach RE in schools across South East Queensland. As well as this, brekky clubs have been hosted, partnering with local chaplains. We see this as an incredible opportunity to continuously impact and influence current and future generations.

Embassy School Teams, have been able to reach into 8 high schools on a regular basis through brekky clubs. On average, they have connected with 500+ students weekly and mobilised 25 volunteers. The impact of these interactions is being seen as many young people have attended Embassy youth programs.

Mimi’s House

Mimi’s House (a flagship program of Hope Centre Services) is an innovative, early intervention program that partners with primary schools to support the social, emotional and physical development of children who are at risk of disengaging with their education.

A ‘Mimi’s kid’ spends a day a week (for 1 year) in Mimi’s House, building their social skills, learning life skills and understanding their value. They are supported in a nurturing, home-like environment by a dedicated team of staff and volunteers who also get to know parents, siblings, teachers, guidance counsellors and other people in the child’s life.


Since 2012, Mimi’s House has supported over 300 children and by extension their families. 2019 has been our biggest year yet, with 56 young people benefitting from the program. Children, parents and teachers alike reported that, on average:

Our Mimi’s Kids showed

- Improved ability to pay attention in class.
- Improved behaviour including: feeling more physically composed, having fewer fears and worries, sharing more with other children.
- Improved moods.

New initiatives include

- In 2019 we launched a new program operating out of the Brisbane campus. We have welcomed 10 children from a new partnership school and we are already starting to see noticeable changes in their behaviour
- New partnership schools at our Rothwell site. Mimi’s House at Rothwell operates 5 days a week and this year, we have 46 children from 6 local state schools.
- We continue to partner with Social Ventures Australia who is helping us to engage strong long-term partnerships and develop effective evaluation tools.

ESL

As our city becomes more multicultural, services such as Hope Centre's English Conversation classes (ESL) become more relevant and play an ever-important role in engaging with people from various nations, many of whom have never experienced church or the love of Jesus. Headed by Pila Kulig and Paul Bradley, your support of ESL is showing kindness by helping students and immigrants learn English and better engage with the community around them. You also help to run a IELTS class which is pivotal in helping people from other nations, many in tough situations, become residents of our amazing city and country. Strategically scheduled before the Sunday night service, students are encouraged to attend church and hear the Good News with many continuing to accept Jesus into their lives!

Circuit Breaker

Police in Australia are called to a domestic violence incident every 2 minutes, as the prevalence of this shameful social problem seems only to be worsening. Our Circuit Breaker program has been developed over 18 years of clinical and group therapy to provide practical help for anyone whose temper is affecting the quality of their relationships. By training volunteer facilitators in churches, neighbourhood centres and prisons in the delivery of the program, HCS has been building the capacity of communities across South East Queensland to prevent domestic violence before it even takes root.

Cultural Advocacy and Support

Our Logan location has opened doors of opportunity for us to work alongside migrants and Pacific Islanders. Through our Cultural Advocacy and Support program, we are helping them with job seeking, life skills, settling into the community and language support. Through the course of the year, we get to journey and assist over 20 families in terms of resume and cover letter writing, job searching and job interview skills.

Mainly Music

One way that we are assisting families in need is through our Mainly Music program. Mainly Music enables a safe environment for young children to play, dance, sing and learn. We have established healthy connections and relationships with over 20 families in the Logan community through this initiative.

She Stands For Justice

Jesus had a revolutionary perspective on women – we see in the Gospels that He wanted the women He encountered to feel value, esteem and purpose, despite a prevailing culture that taught them otherwise. She Stands for Justice continues to empower women to bring justice for those who bear the weight of injustice in our communities and beyond. Through the leadership of our Senior Pastor, Lyn Alcorn, we have seen momentous growth in She Stands for Justice – firstly seeing female leaders raised up within Hope Centre, and secondly, seeing a broader range of churches from across the nation gather to be educated and empowered in the outworking of Biblical justice.

Youth Alive

Youth Alive, our ACC national youth ministry continues to expand across our nation. Their mandate is to reach, raise and resource young people. Each year they see tens of thousands of high school students gather at their annual UNITED WE STAND event. These gatherings are hosted in over 70 locations across Australia and they have seen thousands of students say yes to Jesus for the first time! Our Embassy youth teams are an integral part of these gatherings; helping with preparations leading up to the events, as well as leading, imparting and praying for young people as they encounter Jesus.

Next

The NEXT program continues to grow and impart into the upcoming generation of leaders. The program itself is to create a solid foundation and a clear pathway for the up and coming generation to fulfil the call of leadership they have on their life. These young leaders meet over the course of the year to be equipped, inspired and directed towards further developing that call through training and discipleship with the Senior Pastors. NEXT has been distributed to our partner churches across Australia and America who are also using the program to equip and train their young people.

Men's Event

There is a real need, in our generation, for the men of our nation to discover their identity and freedom in Jesus. It's a thrill for our church to be part of something fresh that God is doing in this important area.

The annual Men's Event is gaining momentum as a catalyst for men to gather (from many churches) to be motivated, inspired and helped.

This one day event features world renowned speakers, community leaders and other inspirational identities combined with our Hope Centre team for a dynamic gathering.

The result, is a day which galvanises men to stand shoulder to shoulder in friendship; equipped to turn their personal faith into action.

Hope Connect

As a leadership church, Hope Centre invests into the leadership of several churches across the nation. Our senior leadership have the opportunity to gather with and train the leaders of these churches with the goal to see them resourced and strengthened to reach their communities for Jesus.

Hope Academy

Our God is a missional God, so we believe mission should be a fundamental part of our identity as a College. Interns are involved weekly in a wide range of local mission projects through our Community Outreach initiative. We have encouraged them in providing ongoing practical, emotional, and spiritual support in various schools across Brisbane, including the implementation of the Shine and Strength program. Our students also have opportunities to engage within various university programs and provide support to other individuals in need within our community.

In addition to incorporate mission within the weekly program, Hope Academy students participate in a yearly mission trip to Alice Springs where they support the local church in its outreach to the community. This year, our second year interns are travelling to Northern Asia for the first time to support local missionaries with practical needs and sharing the gospel.

Hope Academy continues to grow in strength both academically and through the core internship program. The college is designed and tailored not just to educate a cohort built from Hope Centre based students, but it also has a heart to equip and empower people from all churches. Our focus this year has been on giving interns the ability to discover their identity in Christ, and how this impacts the way they outwork ministry in their own lives.


Digital Evangelism

Worship Together

Five years ago we had a vision to see the Kingdom of God expand across the nation in a way that encouraged worship teams, across all denominations, to connect with one another, while experiencing greater freedom and encouragement within worship. Our heart has always been to see Psalm 133 come to fruition and we truly believe there is an amazing blessing that comes from 'how wonderful and pleasant it is when brothers live together in harmony'. In the last 12 months Worship Together has expanded further across Australia, with events being hosted in multiple locations on the Central Coast NSW. More than individual events, Worship Together has not only strengthened genuine Kingdom relationships, building connections across the ACC, but also with many other denominations.



A Hope Centre – A story of Enduring Partnership.

On February 1st this year, Newlife Church in Nambour on the Sunshine Coast officially became a Hope Centre. But to those who have been part of Newlife since its beginnings, there is a definite sense of déjà vu.

In 1931, a growing number of people who had been baptised in the Spirit, meeting in houses and sheds around Nambour, realised they needed guidance and supervision from someone with theological training. They reached out to Covenant Christian Church in Brisbane (later renamed Glad Tidings Tabernacle, now Hope Centre). In 1936 they officially formed the first Pentecostal Church on the Sunshine Coast.

Over its history, Newlife has seen 2 revivals, planted many churches on the Coast, sent and supported dozens of missionaries, started a thriving Christian school and a radio station, as well as running tent crusades and many hugely successful outreaches, reaching up to 1000 members at one point.

In 2018, the leadership realised they needed significant help and so, once again Newlife reached out to Hope

Centre for support and oversight. Sensing the hand of God, Pastors Wayne & Lyn agreed and sent long-time friends Pete & Kaz Hewitt to Newlife in February 2019.

Right away Hope Centre welcomed the Newlife family with open arms and plenty of much needed practical support. Worship leaders come up from Brisbane every 3 weeks to help the music team. With the support of the Hope Centre Kids team, we have seen our own team of kids leaders double. A youth pastor has been appointed and an office manager has also started. These new team members have been offered open access, advice and training from the Hope Centre team.

Now, a few months into this new season, the church has started growing again with over 40 new people joining the congregation. The relationship with the school has been strengthened and is healthy and synergistic with hundreds of kids (and parents) filling the church building twice each week for chapel. There is an almost tangible sense of anticipation in the air, thanks to this enduring partnership between Hope Centre and Newlife that has been rekindled after all these years. The future is bright!

- Continual growth in Church attendance with many new people.
- Continual growth with both leaders and volunteers.
- Incredible momentum in our ministry streams.
- A Sunday night service began in 2019 and is thriving with great connection after the service reaching new members of the community.
- Our global mission rapidly expanding with new partnerships and relationships developing with a number of partners in India, Vietnam and China.
- A continual number of salvations and integration of Indigenous people in our main campus and a shift away from the dominant social divide that is common to the rest of Alice Springs.
- Numerous salvations, baptisms and testimonials of transformed lives.
- Our Local NGO, "Desert Life Services" has flourished in adding to our local mission expression, focussing on: The Alice Springs Women's Shelter, Shine in schools and community groups.
- An inaugural Help Day in 2018 which was a great success as over 100 volunteers converged on the Gap Youth Centre and assisted in a number of necessary renovations.
- Regular outreach team visiting the prison and sharing faith.
- Leading the annual Town Christmas Carols with over 5,000 people in attendance.
- Young adult program established with new leadership.
- Renovations to our foyer creating a greater space for connection after our services.
- Growth of our Cert IV Bible College Program.
- Finke Desert Race Trackside Outreach and an Open Air Service.
- Greater community connection in general to build regional influence.
- Establishment of our "Hope Team" serving across multiple areas of Church life.



VIETNAM

Josh & Rach

Josh & Rach have been in Vietnam for 2 years now. During this time, they have been involved in a number of community engagement projects which have included:

Taking a small team of people into a leprosy village where they were able to supply basic necessities to 72 families impacted by this terrible disease.

Partnering with a charity to assist in building a live-in crisis centre for women in need. These women will not only have a place to live, but they will also be

given assistance with their journey as a new mum.

Partnering with the Danang Charity Association to assist poorer families within the community to access small business loans to help them break the cycle of poverty and become self sufficient.

In recent months, Shannon Graham, who completed the Hope Academy Internship, has joined the team with Josh & Rach at Hope United, assisting them as they work with children.

Kelvin & Rebekah

Kelvin and Rebekah have given leadership to AOG World Relief Vietnam, working alongside many community leaders to develop programs for sustainable and transformational change in Da Nang and villages that surround the city. Their focus is on the areas of health, hygiene & first aid training, supply of medical equipment, resourcing schools and so much more.

One very exciting opportunity has been a project to provide early detection and prevention heart checks for over 3,000 children. These health checks help children in rural areas be screened for heart issues and receive follow up on any medical conditions identified as a result of these checks.

Adopt a Village

In 2018, our 2nd year Interns travelled to Tam Thanh (Hope Village) to continue strengthening our relationship with AOG World Relief Vietnam. They

were involved in activities to upgrade a Medical Centre as well as teaching on hygiene, road safety, child safety (as it relates to trafficking), self worth and basic English in a local school. They were the first foreigners to visit this school and it helped to build new relationships between the community and AOGWR.

Hope Academy interns first visited a particular village kindergarten in 2017 to start a food plant solutions program to improve nutrition for young children. This program is now fully operational and delivers healthy and nutritional options to children who were once lacking the right foods for their healthy development. Because of the input from AOGWR through the sponsorship from HC, the community has initiated and installed a large amount of home made play equipment. This has transformed the kindergarten site making it more inviting and a place where children can play in safety. More importantly, it shows tangible evidence of a change of mindset in the community that they can make a difference with what they have. No other kindergarten in or around the community has what this kindergarten has.

NORTH ASIA

Ross & Donna

It's been an incredibly fulfilling period for Ross and Donna in recent months.

They continue to reach out to local community students through a language exchange program.

The team continues to reach out to children through after-school programs, Hope Central food and fun nights.

The work at Future Hope Community Centre reaches out to the families within the local community. Last year, they planted a church. Ross wrote, "There were some real Holy Spirit moments as a visiting band ministered at our church – a great response and people were set free by Jesus."

There are so many exciting things happening in this part of the world, as Ross, Donna and their team continue to demonstrate love and care in their community. Reaching some of the poorest of the poor, they are seeing many people respond to 'love in action'.

Intern Band Trip

Music is a universal language and it is being used to reach thousands of young people. In July of this year, a small team (band) of Hope Academy 2nd year Interns will travel across to participate in concerts at venues in a new area. This is ground breaking and an incredible opportunity for these students.

One Day

In 2010, a very simple idea of asking people to donate one day's salary to bring lasting impact to communities around the world has translated into close to \$2million. Monies raised have provided Bibles, trained Christian workers, built wells, purchased mobility aids for the disabled, hosted women's conferences, taught good health practices and so much more. Hope Centre partners with ACCI and contributes to this initiative by donating our Christmas Day offering each year. Your generosity is making a significant difference to many lives and is transforming communities across the world.

One Life

Being a One Life Partner, strengthens ACCI as they not only staff their Operations Centre, but also provide practical assistance and advice to field workers. This partnership helps to ensure that our monthly mission contributions have the best possible impact.

Disaster Relief
